JM Coetzee has published sixteen works of fiction, as well as criticism and translations. In 2003 he won the Nobel Prize for Literature. He is Professor of Literature at the University of Adelaide.

Gail Jones' acclaimed body of work includes two short story collections and the novels Black Mirror, Sixty Lights, Dreams of Speaking, Sorry, Five Bells and A Guide to Berlin. She is Professor in Writing at Western Sydney University.

Alexis Wright is a member of the Waanyi Nation of the Gulf of Carpentaria. She is the author of the award-winning novels Carpentaria and The Swan Book and, most recently, Tracker, launched this month. She is a Distinguished Fellow at Western Sydney University.
